Procedure to Respond to Disruptions to the Worship Service

As members of First-St. Andrew's United Church, we strive to be inclusive and compassionate. We celebrate diversity and welcome all individuals. As the same time, we have a duty to protect our congregation and staff from harassment, threats, and physical harm. For that reason, we have outlined a response to disruptions to the Worship Service.

Narthex Co-ordinator and Atrium Steward

- -On arrival at church, the **Narthex Co-ordinator** will determine who and where the Atrium Stewart and Support Staff are that day.
- -When a threat is perceived, the **Narthex Co-ordinator** will alert the Atrium Steward and the Support Staff.
- -If the disruption occurs in the Atrium, the **Atrium Steward** will alert the Support Staff.
- -The **Narthex Co-ordinator** will ask someone to video the interaction between staff and disruptor.

Minister

-If the person enters the sanctuary, the **minister** will welcome the person and ask him/her to sit down and respectfully join us in Worship.

Support Staff and Atrium Steward

- -These staff members will evaluate the threat posed by the intruder:
 - If they determine person is not intentionally disrupting the service, the staff member could sit with the person and quietly converse or could invite the person downstairs for a coffee. Both of these staff members will stay together, so no one is alone with this person.
 - If the person is intentionally disrupting the service, staff will ask him/her to leave. If they do not leave, the staff will call the **police at 519-661-5670**
 - In an extreme situation, where evacuation of the church is required, the fire alarm should be pulled so the Sunday School also knows of the need to leave. The minister could also assess the situation and ask people to evacuate the church. Staff will call 911.
